Class Placement Process

At Papamoa College we believe that learning should be a personalised process. The start of this process begins with the placement of students into their learning commons with their teachers. Each student is placed on an individual basis, with consideration given to their learning style, personal interests, social groupings and teacher feedback.

Our Year 7 students have been placed using information provided from their contributing school and through interviews between the Year 6 teachers of our local primary schools and our Deputy Principal responsible for class placements.

Our current Year 8, 9 and 10 students have been placed using our current learning records and staff input regarding the learning needs of each child.

A great deal of time and care is placed into our class allocations in order to best suit the needs of all of our students, and it is part of our commitment to personalised learning at Papamoa College.

Attendance & Absences

Students are expected to attend school every weekday throughout the term, from 8.50am to 3.10pm.

Student attendance will be recorded throughout the school day. Any absence or lateness to class will be recorded.

If your child is going to be absent or late to school, the parent/guardian needs to phone Reception as soon as possible on 542 0676 and press 1 to explain the reason. If the absence is not phoned through then the parent/guardian will receive a text or phone call from Reception to check the absence. The student must bring a note from you when they next return to school.

Known future absences from school for any medical or family reason must be advised by parents/guardians in advance wherever possible.

Appointments during the school day

If students have an appointment during the day which means they have to leave school, students must get your written note authorised by Reception. Before school begins, students should go to Reception with a signed note from the parents/guardians. The office administrator will sign your note and then give it back to the student.

Buses for 2012
