I wish to welcome those of you who are new to the Papamoa College community. We very much look forward to working with you and your child for their education this year.

Congratulations to all those students who were rewarded with successful 2016 National Standards and NCEA results. The school has shown consistent improvements in student achievement over the last few years. The results for 2016 were no different.

2016 Summary Student Achievement:

National Standards

Year 7: Reading 74%, Writing 67%, Mathematics 67% Year 8: Reading 88%, Writing 77%, Mathematics 80% Achievement for both year 7&8 students have shown increased achievement in comparison to their achievement in the previous year.

NCFA

Level 1 Certificate 70% (L1 Excellence Endorsements 31%) Level 2 Certificate 91% (L2 Excellence Endorsements 11%) Level 3 Certificate 73% (L3 Excellence Endorsements 18%) The overall levels of achievement for NCEA certificates are pleasing, and have also shown improvements in comparison to previous years. The proportion of Merit and Excellence Endorsements have also increased in comparison to previous years.

The reporting of the above summary student achievement results is very general, and provides limited information on how individual and groups of students are achieving. Teaching staff use a wide range and very specific achievement tools to analyse student learning. If you have questions about the achievement and progress of your own child at anytime throughout the year, I encourage you to contact their teacher/s.

We are responding to a fast growing Papamoa, with the creation of a new learning community Puna wai. It is situated in what was the Library space by the bridge. The Library has been relocated to Patiki and will provide a more mobile library service to the school.

We welcome 14 new teachers and 2 new support staff to the school. Welcome back to Mr Dave Ballard -Deputy Principal Senior School, who was on leave during 2016.

Attendance & Absences

Students are expected to attend school every weekday throughout the term, from 8.40am to 3.10pm. Student attendance will be recorded throughout the school day. Any absence or lateness to class will be recorded.

If your child is going to be absent or late to school, parent/caregivers need to phone Reception as soon as possible on 542 0676 and press 1 to explain the reason. If the absence is not phoned through then the parent/caregiver will receive a text or phone call from Reception to check the absence. The student must bring a note from home when they next return to school.

Known future absences from school for any medical or family reason must be advised by parents/caregivers in advance whenever possible.

Appointments during the school day

If students have an appointment during the day, which means having to leave school, a written note must be authorised by Reception and then shown to a learning commons teacher/admin teacher.


