Hapai Rangatahi Award

The kotiate was a prized weapon and often favoured by chiefs when speech-making. The kotiate is noted for the carved notches on either side of the blade which represent the shape of the liver, a common target on the body when used as a weapon. The curving in on the sides and the notches this creates were used in a ripping action, and the word kotiate literally means 'to divide, split in two'. The Kotiate was selected for the Supreme Award for Hapai Rangatahi as the curved in sides represents the path that our rangatahi will take in life, and while this path may not always be straight and they may hit obstacles along their journey as they move between two worlds, they will find their way out again with the strength of their cultural identity behind them.
